On 5/5, we will meet at Patapsco Valley Park for our spring hike. The park opens at 9 and the parking lot we are meeting at (6290 River Rd, Elkridge, Md, 21075) fills fast, it is highly recommended that you arrive at 9. We will start at 9:30. It is free to enter, but details are being worked out with the park service. Carpooling is suggested due to limited parking. Once in the park, you will pass the Orange Grove lot, use these bathrooms before going down to the lot for our trail. There is no water, make sure you pack it (a Cub Scout essential (9)). The hike is about 2.5 miles on mostly flat, paved terrain. There is a small section where it is not paved and you have to climb up on some hills and over some rocks, but all scouts should be able to do this. At the end we will come back to the parking lot and those that are ready to leave may. For those who would like to go more, there is a waterfall that is up a trail from the parking lot, the trail is a little steep and the rocks around the falls may be a little big for the smallest scouts, but it is a beautiful view and fun!




